THE GODFATHER:

YES BECAUSE WE HAVE NO CHOICE unless you want to be used like a condom chanting slogans like pasi nevanoti Eve haatongi or wear hovhorosi like james pande in and outbof season

COMMANDER LUCKY:

Kikkkkk...

MALVERN CHIMUTASHU:

This experience is going to be priceless thou

When tome comes we shall make good use of it

LT-GEN THE BANS:

Bvisai Zita raPande apo its insulting my brother

CDE ROEZE:

Which experience cde? ? Doing nothing and wait for the older to succumb?

Surely there must be a choice

Lt, stand down

4)the rich have become richer and thw poor poorer in the context of the economy leaving a wide gap of the middle class. What policies can we pursue to create a thriving middle class?

COMMANDER LUCKY: U may answer the 4th qn cde malvin

MALVERN CHIMUTASHU: The elder must succumb there is no other way experience has taught us well...

As for james pande where is the insult he does that so i say it as it is

COMMANDER LUCKY: Answer only moderators cde..

CDE ROEZE: Cde Malvern respond to moderators

MALVERN CHIMUTASHU: Middle class can only thrive when the key sector of the economy is functioning properly and this sector being Agriculture i think the sector can pick up all the broken pieces

MALVERN CHIMUTASHU: Get industry working and everyone working too with a guaranteed future

COMMANDER LUCKY: And if we have incessant poor rains and drought what mechanism do we prefer?

CDE ROEZE: Cde Chimutashu, surely that is why my fellow colleague asked that, "WHAT POLICIES SHUD WE FOLLOW"..We know a viable agricultural sector will ensure a better economy but what mechanisms are we going to apply?

COMMANDER LUCKY: Well enough

CDE ROEZE: 6) one can argue that currently Zanupf is at its weakest due to factional fights. May u elaborate the main cause of factions and how this can be addressed?

I bet you are laying it all out for us cde!!!

MALVERN CHIMUTASHU: I politics there is nothing called factionalism cdes get over it.if we are going for elections on this platform and Roez and say Masamba are contenders if i stand behind masamba and gloriane stands behind Roez where is the wrong? After all it finishes rite after the elections!

Factionalism in our case is being used by the zanu pf strongman to place his preffered where he wants them.

Mai mujuru was fired and noone who gets fired gets benefits but if she is foolish she can take the security aides she is rich enough to look after herself maona

COMMANDER LUCKY:

Ok we will move on....tichadzidza zvakawanda

CDE ROEZE:

I think its wrong to say there is nothing called factionalism..a grup of people serving the same interests are a faction..e.g the group that supports eve etx

And Mai Mujuru is entitled to those benefits (see Constitution)

Moving along :

MALVERN CHIMUTASHU:

COMMANDER LUCKY:

7) the doctrine of separation of powers entitles that there should be clear separation between and among the executive, legislature and the judiciary. In our case we have individuals who are MPs, Ministers and hold influential positions in the party. What is your assertion on the current system?
